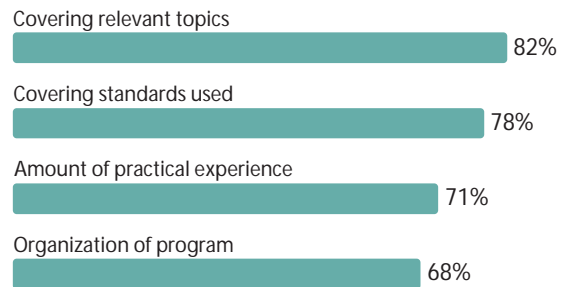
Evaluations

82% of respondents (5 out of 6) stated that the program covered relevant topics.

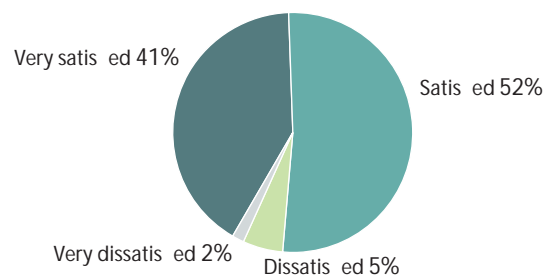
78% of respondents (3 out of 4) stated that the program covered standards used.

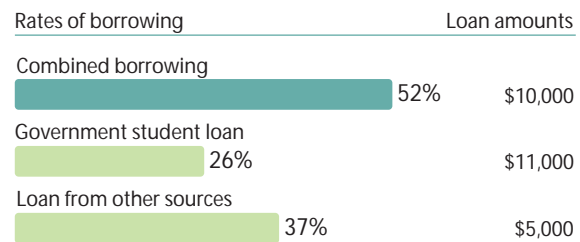


Funding

37% of respondents (3 out of 4) stated that they had borrowed from other sources.

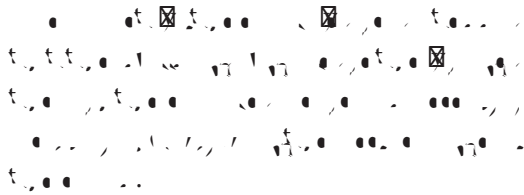

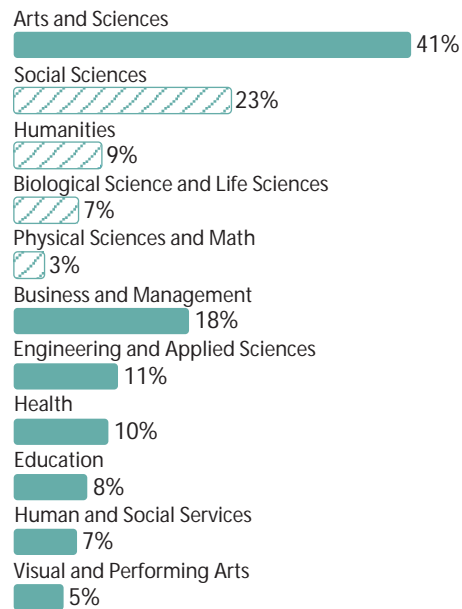
65% of respondents (3 out of 4) stated that they would like to attend further studies.

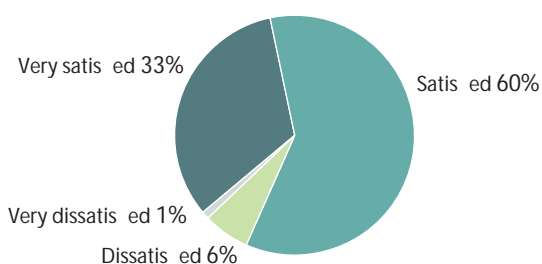
Evaluations

Quality of instruction was rated very good or good by 94% of respondents. Core program courses were rated very good or good by 89% of respondents. 74% of respondents said they would take the program again.



Note: Percentages are of those who said the instruction and courses were very good or good, based on respondents who gave a rating, excluding those who said not applicable. A four-point scale (from very good to very poor) was used. The percentage of those who said they would take the same program again is based on all respondents.

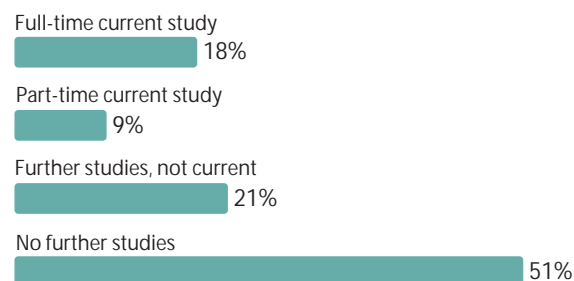
Total financial debt was \$22,000. Government student loan debt was \$20,000. Remaining government debt was \$19,000.

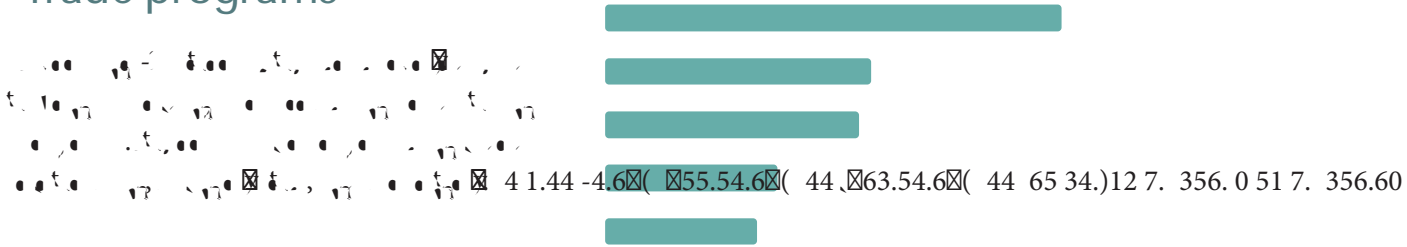

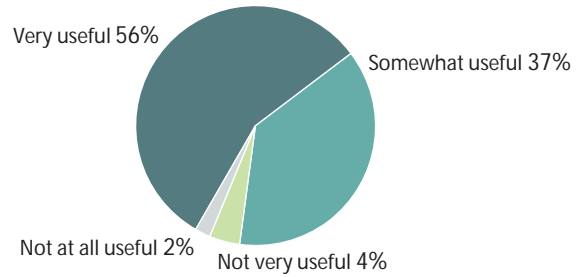

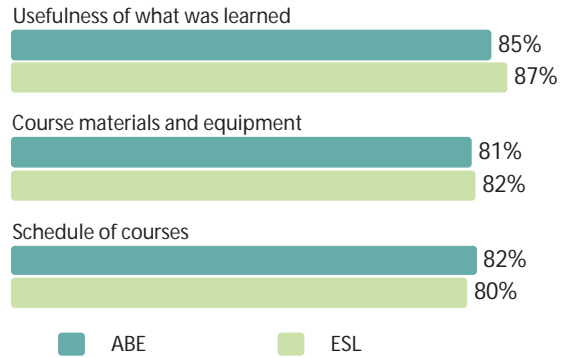

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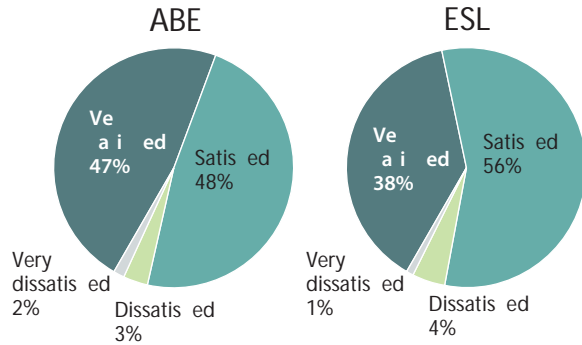
Evaluations

Students were also surveyed about their satisfaction with the ABE program (5 weeks) and the ESL program. The results are shown in the following pie charts.

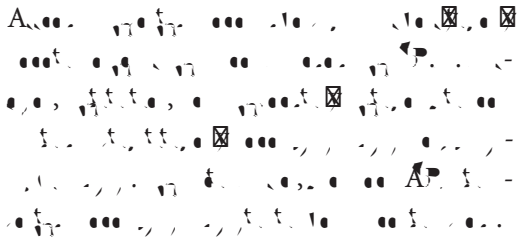
